Section 3: Hazard Identification

Signs and Symptoms of Exposure:

Eye: Eye irritant. Can cause severe irritation, redness, tearing, and blurred vision.

Skin: Skin irritant. Prolonged contact can cause dryness, redness and itching or a burning sensation.
